


MESSAGE

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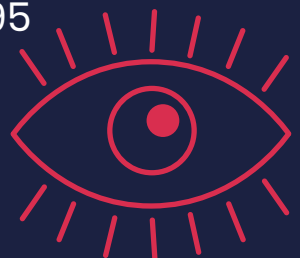

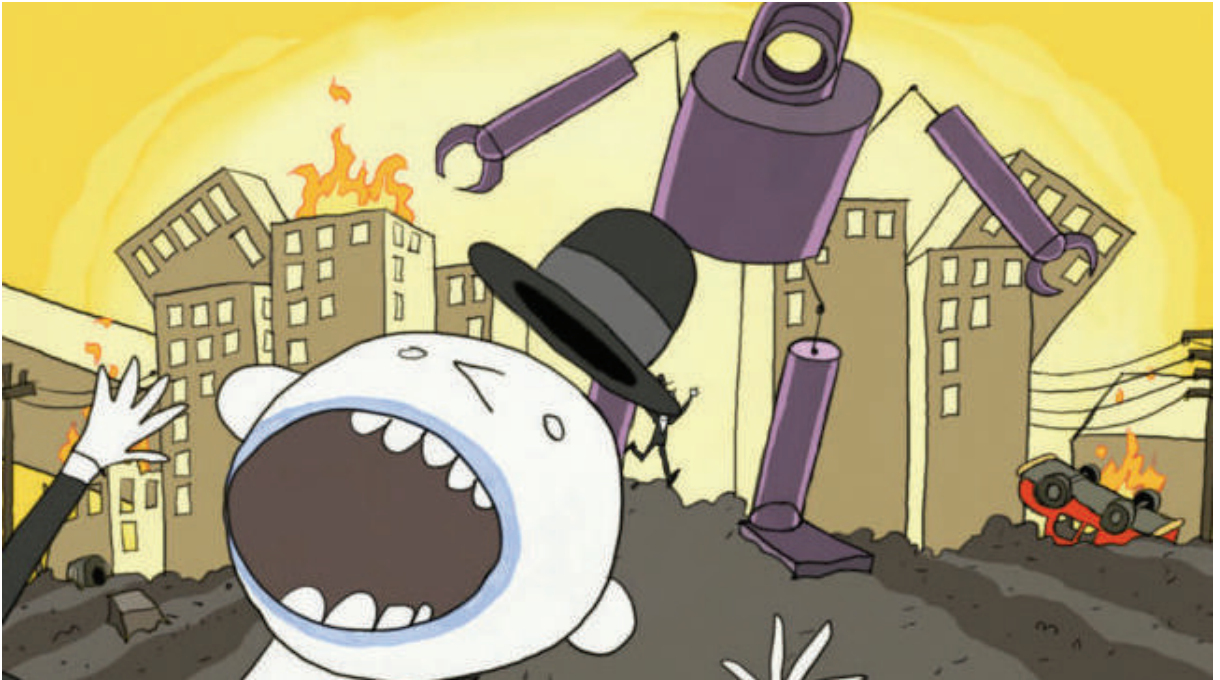

Cordell Barker is a two-time Oscar®-nominated animator known for his long association with the National Film Board of Canada (NFB), where his films have earned over 50 international awards. He is best known for creating acclaimed animated shorts such as *The Cat Came Back* and *Strange Invaders*, which blend humour and heart and often feature ordinary characters in surreal situations. Barker's latest and fifth NFB film, *Good Luck to You All*, is a whimsical exploration of artificial intelligence.

DR. G. PRABHA

Chairperson

Dr. G. Prabha is an Indian filmmaker, writer, and retired Professor of Sanskrit, holding a doctorate from the University of Madras. He is best known for writing and directing 'Ishti (2016)', the first Sanskrit-language feature film to address a social theme rather than a mythological or biographical subject. He also produced two Malayalam documentaries – 'Akkitham (2010)', on the celebrated Malayali poet, and 'Agnaye (2012)', on a Vedic fire ritual. During his academic tenure, he published 26 research papers and authored several books in Malayalam and Sanskrit.



REVATHY SURESH

Revathy Suresh is an Indian filmmaker, visual storyteller, and classical performing artist with over a decade of experience across Malayalam, Tamil, and Hindi cinema. Mentored by filmmaker Priyadarshan and having collaborated with cinematographers Santosh Sivan and Thirunavukarasu, she served as VFX Associate Director on Mohanlal's fantasy feature 'Barroz'. A disciple of Padma Vibhushan Dr. Padma Subrahmanyam, her classical Bharatanatyam training deeply informs her cinematic language. Her award-winning short film 'Thank U' received recognition for its experimental storytelling and emotional depth. She has also directed major cultural events in collaboration with the International Film Festival of Kerala (IFFK) and international productions in the Middle East.

BRIAN TILLEY

Brian Tilley came to film from theatre in 1981 to work on independent documentaries, and in 1985 was a founding member of the Video Collective VNS/Afravision, which made documentaries about social and political issues in South Africa. His film 'Fruits of Defiance (1990)', about the mass defiance campaign and the release of Nelson Mandela, won first prize in the Third World section of the Montreal Television Festival. His drama series 'The Line (1994)', which he wrote and directed, was broadcast worldwide and won two South African Artes Awards for screenplay and direction. He has also directed documentary series for Al Jazeera, including My Nigeria and My Cuba, produced from Cape Town.



CARLOS FEDERICO ATEHORTÚA ARTEAGA

Federico Atehortúa Arteaga was born in 1990 in Medellín, Colombia. He studied film directing at the Universidad del Cine in Buenos Aires and holds a Master's in Creative Documentary from Universidad Pompeu Fabra in Barcelona. He is the founding partner of the independent production house Invasión Cine. His second feature, 'Forensics (Forenses)', won the Proxima Special Jury Prize at the 60th Karlovy Vary International Film Festival. The film explores the intertwined stories of Colombia's disappeared, connecting personal loss and national identity through memory and ongoing search efforts.

IVÁN DARIEL ORTIZ LANDRON

Iván Dariel Ortiz is a Puerto Rican film director who began his studies at the University of Sagrado Corazón in San Juan before traveling to Maine in the United States to train in cinematography, later working as a camera assistant, editor, and producer. His short film *Héroes de Otra Patria*, about two Puerto Ricans fighting in the Vietnam War, won Best Short Film at the San Juan Cinemafest. He expanded it into a feature film that was selected as Puerto Rico's entry for the Best Foreign Language Film at the 71st Academy Awards. The film was also selected by the Lincoln Center Film Society in New York as one of the best Latin American films. His 2025 film *De Tal Palo* was screened at the 56th International Film Festival of India (IFFI).

With over 50 years in journalism, Gangadhara Mudaliar served as Assistant Editor at Prajavani, one of Karnataka's most respected Kannada dailies. A pioneering film historian, critic, and author of 18 books, he is widely credited with shaping Kannada film culture. His contributions have been recognised with the Karnataka Government's TSR Lifetime Achievement Award, Rajyotsava Award, Sahitya Academy Award, and the Kempegowda Award, among others.



DR. NAYANA R

Dr. Nayana R. is a media professional and academic bringing over 17 years of experience across higher education and media production. Holding a Ph.D. in Mass Communication and Journalism, she currently serves as Creative & Content Head at ITV. Her public service credentials include serving as an empaneled Documentary Director for the Government of Kerala's IPR Department, Advisory Panel Member for the Central Board of Film Certification, and member of the Media Monitoring Cell for the Kerala State Women's Commission.

Himanshu Prajapati is a National Award-winning writer-director and FTII graduate based in Mumbai. His short film 'Teen Don Ek' won the 69th National Film Award for Best Film on Social Issues, while his recent film 'Slow Steppers' premiered at the Kolkata International Film Festival. As a screenwriter, he co-wrote 'A Night of Knowing Nothing', winner of the Golden Eye at Cannes, and contributed to 'All We Imagine As Light', recipient of the Grand Prix at Cannes 2024.



ISAAC JOSEPH BANKS

Isaac Joseph Banks is a New York-based cinematographer and producer whose work has earned selection at some of the world's most prestigious festivals, including Venice, BFI London, Rotterdam, Tribeca, and the International Film Festival of India. A graduate of the University of North Carolina School of the Arts, his breakthrough feature 'Lingua Franca (2019)' premiered at Venice Days, and his most recent collaboration 'Moonglow (2026)' premiered at Rotterdam. His producing work includes 'Pescador (2025)', which had its world premiere at IFFI 2025.

ANOMAA RAJAKARUNA

Anomaa Rajakaruna is a curator, programmer, photographer, and documentary filmmaker from Sri Lanka whose work spans over two decades. Through her films, she has addressed critical issues such as women in armed conflict, displacement, and violence against women. She serves as Festival Director of the Jaffna International Cinema Festival and is the Founder of the Agenda 14 Short Film Festival in Colombo. As Artistic Director of the Colombo International Women's Film Festival and curator of 10 editions of the European Film Festival in Sri Lanka, she has served as a juror at over 20 national and international film festivals. Her notable directorial works include *Our Mother, Grandmother, Prime Minister: Sirimavo* (2023) and *The Sixth Land* (2020).

RITA DUTTA

Rita Dutta is a Professor, Film Critic, and Editor whose scholarly work spans national and international cinema discourse. She has edited 'Cinematic Cartography: Mapping the Breadth of Indian Film Landscapes' (2025) and serves as Editor of the international film journal Film Buff. Her critical writings have been published across journals in Spain, France, and several other European countries. She has served as a juror at major international film festivals including Cannes, Busan, Cairo, Kerala, and Kiev, and has delivered lectures in Istanbul, Almaty, Poland, Brazil, China, Germany, and Romania, among other places.



KYOKO ENDO INADA

Kyoko Endo Inada is a Tokyo-born film critic and former editor at leading Japanese publishing house Kobunsha, where she spent two decades in weekly news magazine editing and rights management. Transitioning into film criticism, she has written serialised reviews and conducted interviews for monthly culture magazines and web publications, engaging with filmmakers such as Béla Tarr, Denis Villeneuve, Park Chan-wook, Ryusuke Hamaguchi, and Isabelle Huppert, among others. She has been a member of the Japan Film Pen Club since 2021 and has served on its board since 2025.

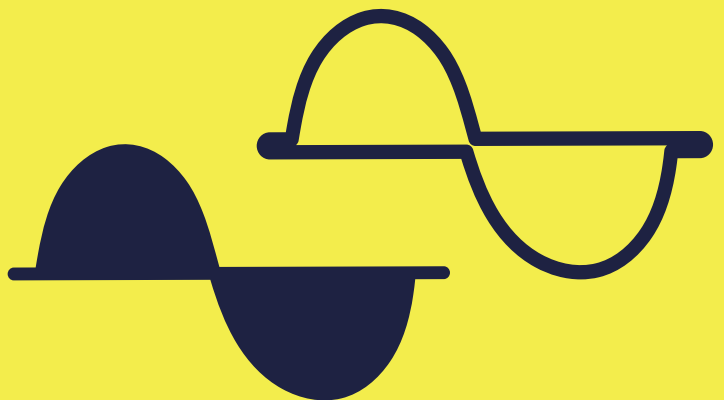

When societal pressures push Srija's marriage to the breaking point, Valli holds onto the hope of a miracle. The film traces one mother's journey of unconditional love against a backdrop of cultural resistance and institutional barriers.

Through intimate interviews, personal archives, and a reflection on his battle with Alzheimer's and dementia, the film reveals a portrait of a man who stayed true to himself until the very end.

He earned his Master's degree in Film Directing from the School of Visual Arts, where he made a series of short films exploring artistic identity, loneliness, and spirituality. Between 1879 and 1920, over 60,000 Indians were taken from Kolkata to Fiji under the British indenture system, deceived by false promises of a better life. What awaited them in Fiji was 41 years of relentless labour in sugarcane fields, violence, and dehumanisation under colonial rule. Women suffered disproportionately, newborns perished due to neglect, and suicides among the Girmitias reached some of the world's highest rates. The film recovers the silenced voices of a generation stripped of dignity.

The film tells the story of Julia Pirotte, a Polish Jewish photojournalist and Resistance fighter in Marseille during WWII who used her camera to document the French Resistance, the Liberation of Marseille, and the Kielce Pogrom of 1946. Her younger sister Maria, also a Resistance courier, was arrested by the Gestapo and executed by guillotine in Wroclaw. The film recovers two largely untold stories of fearless women in the European struggle against fascism.



Dr. Ewa Pytka is a director, screenwriter, producer, script consultant, journalist, poet, singer, and lecturer. A graduate of Polish Philology at Adam Mickiewicz University and of Film Direction at the Lodz Film School, she also trained at the NSFTV in Leeds under the Tempus Programme. CHILEAN ANIMATION

Chilean animation enchants the world like the enigmatic Moai statues of Easter Island, standing timelessly in Polynesia. These films breathe a daring artistic spirit, one that journeys effortlessly from ancient indigenous myths and haunting folklore to the complexities of politics. Chile undoubtedly has its own distinct aesthetics which is reflected in its cinematic art. As a country it has received much recognition in festivals & Oscars, which inspired me to curate a special package that embraces subjects lesser experimented ranging from biography to myth to dreamlike magical realism. Much like the poetry of Chilean Nobel laureates Gabriela Mistral and Pablo Neruda.



RETROSPECTIVE OF RAIMUND KRUMME

Raimund Krumme's distinctive style of minimalism fascinates me! Working primarily with hand drawn black brush strokes and uncluttered white backgrounds, he creates worlds around relationships, conflict and existence. Every movement seems governed by an invisible logic, turning animation into a form of visual labyrinth. What charms me more is that he makes "space" a very important silent character of his stories by playing with all three X,Y,& Z Axes giving endless unpredictable flow of storytelling. His films like poetic metaphors of illusion of life ,remind us that the simplest line can contain an entire world of possibilities that keeps reinventing...
